



What to expect at your child's Well Child Visit

A routine preventive exam includes an age appropriate examination, medical history, health screenings, immunizations and laboratory/diagnostic screenings if needed.

A "typical" Well Child Visit may include but is not limited to:

- Check and discuss growth and development
- Immunizations
- Lab work and age specific screens (e.g., hearing, vision, developmental or depression) may be done and may incur separate charges *(All well child visits and screenings are subject to applicable co-payments, co-insurance and deductibles.)*

Well child exams must be billed to insurance with Well Visit codes that differ from office visit codes used for illness or general health concerns.

When additional time is needed to address an illness, ongoing treatment, or a new health condition, **an office visit may be charged in addition to the Well Child visit.** *(All office visits are subject to applicable co-payments, co-insurance and deductibles.)*

Items addressed at a Well Child visit that may cause an additional office visit charge include, but are not limited to:

- Allergies
- Asthma
- ADD/ADHD
- Back pain
- Cough/cold
- Croup
- Diabetes
- Diarrhea
- Ear infection
- Eczema
- Fever
- Influenza
- Headache
- Joint pain
- New medication prescription or changes to an existing prescription
- Rash
- Sinusitis
- Sore throat/Strep throat
- Stomach pain
- Urinary tract infection
- Vomiting
- Warts
- Wart removal
